

DANA MATHEWSON, PLY

3x Paralympian, Wimbledon Champion, Former Professional Wheelchair Tennis Player, Motivational Speaker

Dana Mathewson is a trailblazer in U.S. wheelchair tennis, recognized as one of the sport's most prominent figures. A three-time Paralympian and the top-ranked American woman, Dana made history in 2022 as the first American woman to win a Grand Slam title with her doubles victory at Wimbledon. Over her illustrious career, Dana secured 16 singles titles and 32 doubles titles. At the 2023 Para Pan American Games in Santiago, Chile, she captured gold medals in both singles and doubles and was honored by her Team USA teammates as a flag bearer. In 2024, she broke new ground again as the first American to compete at the Miami Open Wheelchair Tennis Championship.

Born in San Diego, California, Dana's journey in adaptive sports began after she contracted transverse myelitis, a rare autoimmune disease, at the age of ten. She was introduced to wheelchair tennis at thirteen, which sparked her lifelong passion for the sport. Dana now resides in Orlando, Florida, where she is connected to the USTA National Campus.

In December 2023, Dana married Dristin Hughes, a medical resident, and the couple are proud dog parents to Riley and Beau. Before retiring in October 2024, she qualified for the prestigious NEC Singles Masters, finishing her professional career with a career-high international singles ranking of #7. Beyond her achievements on the court, Dana is dedicated to advancing wheelchair tennis, mentoring future athletes, and organizing clinics to grow the sport. She also collaborates with brands to promote adaptive fashion, leveraging her platform to create meaningful change.

Dana's remarkable career and advocacy efforts have been supported by sponsors such as Adidas Tennis, Deloitte, Wilson Tennis, The Hartford, Dobel Maestro, and RGK Wheelchairs. Her legacy is defined by her excellence, resilience, and commitment to expanding opportunities for adaptive athletes worldwide.

Lendel Bright






